JUMPING 4 JUSTICE DOUBLE DUTCH REVIVAL

This 'Old School' "Funraiser" Takes Aim at a Global Issue

oncentration, coordination and stamina are much needed skills to jump in Double Dutch -- a style of jump-rope, where two ropes are turned counter to one another while a person jumps in the middle of them. Those same skills are needed to address the global issue of violence against women - focused attention, coordination between and among public and private partners, and an enduring resolve to combat the problem.

On May 12, the Middlesex Central Baptist Association of NJ (MCBA), Fountain Baptist Church in Summit, NJ, and Lott Carey will kick off the "Jumping 4 Justice" weekend as they seek to elevate the visibility of gender-based violence which, according to the United Nations, impacts one in three people globally. The weekend's events will start with a virtual panel discussion on gender **justice** as part of the MCBA's 107th semi-annual session beginning at 7 pm. Panelists include Dr. Selina Carter, executive director, Spirit of

he first fifth Sunday each year is the celebration of the Annual Lott Carey Richmond Rally. For 35 years, churches from Richmond and the greater Richmond area – Henrico, Chesterfield,

Goochland, Hanover, King William, Powhatan, and other places – join together in worship and witness to the

Word of God and for the benefit of Lott Carey.

This year's celebration, a virtual experience held on January 30 at the Fifth Baptist Church in Richmond, was a momentous occasion for the Richmond Rally. Rev. Dr. Gina Marcia Stewart, the first woman to serve as President of Lott Carey, was the guest preacher. Following greetings from Lott Carey's executive secretary, Rev. Emmett Dunn and Deacon Ralph Fleming, first vice moderator of the Tuckahoe Baptist Association of Virginia, Dr. Stewart preached a dynamic message from Mark 14:1-9 entitled, "Forever

Touched by Love". She spoke about an unknown woman who gave the best she could with what she had. In her sermon, Dr. Stewart stressed the importance of leaving a legacy; that God deserves our best and we should

give our best to others. In the end, she stated this woman was able to give radical love.

The churches that participate in the Richmond Rally have a history of demon-

strating radical love. Most recently for example, Richmond area churches collected toiletries for the Charles City, VA, home of Lott Carey, our founder. The toiletries were donated to the Charles City School and Community Pantry as a mission project. It is hoped that participating churches will help reach the rally goal of \$15,000 for Lott Carey so that we, too, can touch lives with transforming love.

Dynamic speakers, engaging discussions, inspirational worship – the ideal participant experience touching heart, mind and soul was displayed at the Spring Missions Conference held in Atlanta, GA, March 23-25. Having paused in-person meetings due to the pandemic for two years, the Atlanta gathering gave pastors, church leaders and delegates a chance to get meet and greet one another. More than 250 people attended the hybrid event which was the first for Lott Carey's new president, Rev. Dr. Gina Stewart. Highlights from the conference included:

President's Emphasis. In her remarks, which was shared prior to the preaching moment during the Evening Worship Service, Dr. Stewart shared her priorities for Lott Carey. They are:

- ⇒ Increase Lott Carey's revenue (goal—\$1 Million)
- ⇒ Increase our visibility
- ⇒ Amplify our message
- ⇒ Enlarge our ecumenical footprint
- ⇒ Inspire participation with our emerging generations

WISE Breakout Session presented by Dr. TaNikka Shepppard. The title notwithstanding, From the Sofa to the Sanctuary: Rethinking Religious Spaces, Dr. Sheppard shared the building blocks for "creating sacred spaces" – those places where we can do the work of soul tending. They are being open (access); prioritizing making people seen and heard (acknowledgment); accepting people as they are (acceptance); being supportive and encouraging of one another (affirmation); valuing each other and people's contributions (appreciation); connecting with one another (affinity); a willingness to change (adaptability); and being answerable to each other (accountability).

Dr. Clifton, WISE president, stated that WISE members will be focusing on "creating sacred, safe spaces" throughout the year. Dr. Danielle Brown, pastor, Shiloh Baptist Church, Plainfield, NJ, will be the facilitator for the Women's session during the Annual session which will be followed by a Literary Circle and Master Class on creating safe spaces.

Women in Service Everywhere (WISE) is currently accepting nominations for the **2022 Women of the Week** recognition. The honorees will be announced at the 125th Lott Carey Annual Session in New Orleans, LA.

Women of the Week honorees are women who exemplify a sound and consistent dedication to Christian mission endeavors, both at home and internationally. They are recognized for their work inclusive of local, regional, and Lott Carey initiatives over a 15-year period.

WISE will recognize up to 10 Women of the Week honorees on August 16, 2022, during the Annual Session. **Nominations** forms must be submitted in writing and received by May 23, 2022. Nomination submissions must include:

- ⇒ Full name and address of the nominee
- ⇒ Full name and address of the nominator
- ⇒ Email and Phone # of nominator
- ⇒ Name of nominee's home church
- ⇒ Nominee's Pastor's name
- ⇒ Paragraph describing the rationale for this nomination. Including multiple examples of the nominee's mission involvement, designating if the activity was with the local church, an organization or Lott Carey

The Power of Prayer

The mellifluous sounds of greetings started each morning shortly before the top of the hour– from Delaware, North Carolina, Maryland, South Carolina, Virginia, Florida, New Jersey, Alabama, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Washington, D.C., and many other places. Each prayer warrior is greeted warmly by the WISE Prayer team – "Good morning, Mary;" Good morning, Sister Brenda, Good morning, Pastor Moore" – tak-

ing a few moments to see how everyone was doing. Then promptly, at 6 am, the WISE Prayer team begins the very serious busi-

ness of collectively focusing callers' attention on the plight of women globally. And so once again, Lott Carey WISE puts faith in action during the month of March. Following the 31-Days of Prayer for Women's Empowerment guide, more than 250 prayer warriors called the prayer line to intercede for women on five continents in 26 countries daily. They were joined in prayer by sisters who are incarcerated and unable to call in as well as those who are in halfway houses and other transitional settings. The published prayers for each country underscore the unique challenges women face as a result of engendered racism—acts of overt

discrimination, limited educational opportunities, poverty, mindsets of oppression which cause many to view themselves as "less than," and far too often, violence. Yet, in each published petition to the Lord, as well as the petitions and supplications offered by callers, there is steadfast belief that the God who sees us (El Roi) will bring down the strongholds of racism and sexism.

Although the 31-Days of Prayer for

Women's Empowerment guide is used throughout the month of March, it can be used any time of the year. You can download a copy of the

prayer guide from the Lott Carey website (https://lottcarey.org/wpcontent/uploads/2022/02/ HeraldPrayerGuide22_web.pdf). Additionally, participants were asked to contribute at least \$31 per day in support of women's empowerment initiatives. **The fundraising** goal is \$100,000 by July 31, 2022. 31-Days of Prayer Kickoff Service

The fight against structural "gendered racism" -- a form of oppression directed at women of color, and black women, in particular – is an ageold battle, but thanks to the efforts of generations of activists like those working with Lott Carey to help raise awareness, one day, it may be understood and eliminated.

On Saturday, Feb. 26, Lott Carey's Women in Service Everywhere (WISE) held a "virtual" kickoff to its annual 31-Days of Prayer service for Women's Empowerment, which was hosted by Fountain Baptist Church, in Summit, NJ. This year's event was especially significant for WISE because of the "synchronicity" of Lott Carey's historical milestones also being celebrated, which include:

- ⇒ the 10th annual anniversary of the Women's Global Prayer Guide;
- ⇒ the 200th anniversary of Lott Carey's ministry in Monrovia, Liberia,;
- ⇒ and, the election of Lott Carey's first woman President, Rev. Dr. Gina M. Stewart, Senior Pastor, Christ Missionary Baptist Church, Memphis, TN.

Dr. Stewart's remarks as guest preacher during the kickoff, (Genesis 16: 1-14), set the tone for the time that WISE and its supporters would later come together to pray daily against gender violence for women around the world, during the entire month of March. She reminded everyone that despite our struggles, God El Roi is the God who sees us the way He saw Hagar, who said, "I now see the one who sees me."

"If Lott Carey was alive and serving the least, last and lost today, women that are victims of gender-based violence would be a targeted group – that's just who I believe he was," said Rev. Dr. Angelita Clifton, President of WISE.
