Indeed, the last two-plus years have been challenging for us here in the US and worldwide. Notwithstanding, we took the initiatives to maintain our commitments to all our partners, including responding to needs brought on by COVID-19. None of this would have been possible without your prayers, financial support, encouragement, and presence. To God be the glory for the wonderful things he is doing through us, with us, and for us.

The reports herein are intended to inform you about our mission and ministry and inspire you to remain engaged as together we embrace all that God is calling us to be and do.

SYNOPSIS OF OUR WORK

GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS

Lott Carey's mission thrust remains our primary focus. We are grateful for the many years of global partnerships that allow us to listen and learn how God works in marginalized communities. Our support, large or small, is making an impact in the areas of education, health care, capacity building, pastor's enrichment, and advocacy. We are encouraged by the commitment of our mission partners. Despite significant challenges, our partners are diligent in their service to those in need of love and compassion. Lott Carey celebrates the ministries of Rev. Emile D. E. Sam-Peal, Liberia; Rev. Dr. Kenneth Ebong, Nigeria; Rev. Dr. Roy Thomas, India; Rev. Dr. Henry Mugabe, Zimbabwe; Rev. Together, we are touching lives with the transforming love of Christ.

Ongoing partnerships and new Lott Carey initiatives. To date, your dollars have provided:

CAPACITY BUILDING

Last March, we completed our innovative project supported by a grant from Lilly Endowment, Thriving in Ministry. Pilgrimages of Striving and Thriving gathered a cohort of more than twenty women pastors and a comparable number of younger women pastors and a comparable number of younger pastors on a journey toward thriving. Pastors participated in Intellectual Pilgrimages (48-hour retreats with thought leaders convened in the United States), International Pilgrimages (both cohorts traveled to Canada, the women to Jamaica, and the younger pastors to Arizona because of COVID-19 travel restrictions), and Virtual Pilgrimages (online group and plenary presentations). We produced a 36-episode podcast, *Pilgrimages of Striving and Thriving Podcast*, available online and wherever you get your podcasts. Plans are underway to produce a written product from the lessons learned and insights shared by 2024. To listen to the podcasts, go to lottcarey.org/pastors. NEW INITIATIVES

THRIVING CONGREGATIONS

To strengthen our congregations, we are pleased to announce a new capacity-building initiative, Thriving Congregations.

Purpose

The purpose of this program is to equip pastors and lay leaders to help congregations better recognize their changing social and cultural contexts, clarify values and mission and cultivate Christian practices that can strengthen their vitality, faithfulness, and effectiveness.

Goals

1. To create four regional learning cohorts of congregational pastors and leaders to equip them with tools for helping their congregations to thrive
2. To train cohorts for and consult on implementing needs assessment and asset mapping
3. To train cohorts for and consult on asset-based vision and mission, clarifying
4. To explore culturally and contextually relevant spiritual practices that can contribute to thriving and consult on prioritizing and implementing those chosen by congregations.
5. To help learning cohorts design a plan for ongoing mutual sharing, learning, and support
6. To document what is learned about how congregations process and experience mapping, vision and mission clarifying, and spiritual practices in varying service contexts.
7. To publish, present and distribute replicable models for journeys toward helping congregations to thrive.

This program will support congregations to thrive by building leadership capabilities to discern assets and opportunities, clarify vision and mission, and engage in practices that can empower them to flourish. Congregational leadership teams learning together will strengthen their relationships and skills, and learning in cohorts will build regional networks for mutual sharing and support.

Congregations affiliated with the Lott Carey and partner networks will participate in the program. Most churches in the Lott Carey network are Baptists with predominantly African American memberships. We will recruit learning cohorts in four geographic regions of the United States:

1. The Mid-Atlantic urban cohort will include 8-12 congregations where they serve in increasing gentrifying communities and evolving and/or declining economies.
2. The Mid-Atlantic rural cohort will include 8-12 congregations where many are experiencing changes from black rural to white suburban.
3. The Northeast cohort will include 8-12 congregations where they serve in ethnically diverse, economically stratified, densely populated, and highly secularized contexts.
4. The Southwest cohort will include 8-12 congregations that serve in post-hurricane contexts that have experienced repeated destruction, often without full previous recoveries.

The Thriving Congregations program is fully funded through a generous grant from Lilly Endowment.

COMMUNICATION PLAN

This communication plan will assist Lott Carey in fulfilling our mandate to extend the Christian witness worldwide.

Goals

The primary aim is to develop Lott Carey’s communications strategy, consistently articulate the Lott Carey mission and acquaint the worldwide Baptist family, the wider church, and the public with Lott Carey’s effort to fulfill the mission God has committed to it.

Audiences

The plan is aimed primarily at the communities represented in Lott Carey, and others it hopes will join as partners. These audiences include:

- Directors
- Staff
- Pastors of member churches

- Institutional Donors
- New prospects: Churches and individuals
- Aid Recipients
- Other Partners

An important target group is communicators such as denominational heads of communications, magazine and newspaper editors, bloggers, etc. Whenever possible and wherever the opportunity arises, attempts will be made to reach Baptists and other Christians who do not fall into any of the above groups or categories.

Channels

Lott Carey will communicate through the following channels:

- Press releases, currently done through an account with Constant Contact
- Newsletter created and sent electronically. Link on Lott Carey website
- Magazine printed and mailed. Created electronically with a link on Lott Carey's website

- Newsletter to officers and leaders
- Weekly Prayer Blast, produced and sent to the mailing list in Constant Contact
- Social media, primarily Facebook and Twitter, as well as Pinterest, Instagram, and YouTube. Daily and weekly postings and tweets are done on significant news and events of Lott Carey and in the dissemination of relevant information.

Lott Carey Office of Communications implements, across various communications platforms, the program of work prepared by the communications team who work in close collaboration with the Office of the Executive Secretary-Treasurer, to develop and guide the Lott Carey communications strategy.

Membership Program

This proposal, which the Board approved, is for the creation of a membership program for Lott Carey.

Evidence shows that a membership program is one of the most effective ways nonprofit organizations survive and thrive. Such programs take various forms and are among nonprofits' most important income sources. Because fees are paid on a regular basis – monthly, quarterly, or yearly – membership funds provide stability and a level of certainty. They allow medium and long-term planning as it is easier to forecast the income stream. Members often demonstrate a higher commitment and engagement to the institution or organization.

History suggests that Lott Carey had conceived a membership program in the first half of the 20th century. The “Friends of Missions” program comprised “a select group of Christians who pledged monthly contributions to the headquarters of the convention” (Leroy Fitts, *Lott Carey: First Black Missionary to Africa*). We propose that this program, conceived more than 80 years ago, be revisited and turned into a membership program where individuals make monthly or other regular contributions to the work and ministry of Lott Carey.

Membership models

Two of the various membership models may be especially relevant to Lott Carey. These are members-as-donors and members-as-advocates.

A new membership plan is underway and will be launched in the third quarter of the fiscal year (January-March 2023).

I remain grateful to our staff team for their commitment and dedication. It is very evident that they approach their assignments from the understanding of ministry and not just a job. These individuals continue to demonstrate a passion for our mission and ministry, love for our partners, and creativity and ingenuity in our global engagement. They all have my respect, and I am thankful I can call them friends and colleagues.

Dear Lott Carey Family,



Greetings from Ethiopia, African AIDS Initiative International (AAII). We would like to send our wishes and prayers to our beloved Lott Carey Family. As always, our lives and the lives we are trying to save, are blessed by our friendship and partnership with you.

Even though we are still struggling with COVID and are having difficulty reaching as many people as we would like, HIV/AIDS is still a major issue among students in higher education institutions. During our studies we have found nearly half of the students have very insufficient knowledge of HIV/AIDS. Our main struggle, which continues to this day, is with the problems our female students face on a daily basis, including, but not limited to violence, verbal, physical and sexual harassment from their male counterparts, rural-urban girl interactions (making them believe they are inferior), poverty, and lack of self-esteem. These issues lead to poor academic performance, which, in turn, forces them to leave school to become commercial sex workers to make a living. These environments brew unwanted sexual activities, unwanted pregnancies, STIs and HIV/AIDS infections.

Our AAI Mobile VCT/SRH center, which is fully funded by our Lott Carey family, plays a key role in creating opportunities to move around and provides services in all the targeted areas of higher learning institutions. The mobile unit also allows us to reach those persons who left school due to the above-mentioned conditions. Due to limited funding, it has not been possible to continue with fixed service centers on site for each of the campuses needing testing equipment and fulltime workforce.

We are blessed and grateful that the Lott Carey family has helped fill in the void and helped us move around and identify students, helping them with health awareness, counseling, emergency contraceptives and pregnancy tests. Our attention and major mission continue to be teaching awareness, giving people knowledge of HIV status, and giving information to help them make decisions to protect themselves and the people around them from spreading the disease.

Our Lott Carey family has been supporting our fight against HIV/AIDS pandemic since 2006. We need you more than ever now, since we do not have any fixed centers to provide education and testing services. We rely on you 100% to continue to help save lives. We are grateful and we appreciate you whole heartedly. We pray you will be blessed to do more great things as you always do.

Salutation

The Guyana Missionary Baptist Church –Lott Carey (GMBC) extends best wishes to the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention on its 125th Annual Session. We salute The Reverend Dr. Gina M. Stewart, President

of Lott Carey and celebrate her historic appointment as the first woman to serve as President of Lott Carey. We also extend greetings to The Reverend Dr. John Alexander, Chairman of the Board; The Reverend Emmet Dunn, Executive Secretary-Treasurer; all other Lott Carey officers and participants at the 125th session taking place in-person in New Orleans, Louisiana and virtually under the theme, “*Embrace (Matthew 28:18-20)*.” We pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to empower and direct the Lott Carey global family as we recommit ourselves to God’s missional mandate for the Church. It is my distinct privilege to provide Lott Carey with the GMBC Annual Report for 2021-2022.

Origins and Present Focus

GMBC was founded by The Reverend A. Carlyle Miller, B.A., M.D., and The Reverend Ermeline “Erma” Miller, M.S., in 1960. A context of doctrinal disputes in the Guyana Congregational Church laid the foundation for GMBC birth. GMBC is important to the Christian witness today because it continues to empower congregations and communities to remain

true to the gospel and relevant to the people we serve by continuing to participate in the transformative work of God’s church through evangelism, Christian formation, mission outreach, and Christian stewardship.

GMBC congregations minister to approximately 1000 persons weekly. Additionally, our medical clinic serves about 400 patients weekly. Through the years our approach has evolved, and various professional relationships have helped to expand our reach globally. For example, as our primary supporting partner Lott Carey continues to support our efforts to be the church at work in today’s world in ways that are relevant and fitting for our context. GMBC partnership in the global Lott Carey family provides opportunities for reciprocal mission engagement and provides practical and concrete examples of what it means to be a part of the Church Universal. GMBC’s core values are community, care, compassion, and generosity.

Community — At GMBC we believe that the church is called to be a community of believers (Acts 2:42-47 and Acts 4:32-35), who desire to follow Christ and live in neighborly relationships with one another. Therefore, GMBC pastors encourage opportunities to foster Christian community amongst congregants. Additionally, GMBC Youth, Women, Men, and Clergy councils work at a national level to coordinate various opportunities to facilitate community amongst GMBC congregations. The Councils bolster teachings that facilitate Christian growth, promote fellowship and encourage leadership development. Some highlights of our life together during this reporting period are indicated below:

- **Weekly Corporate worship** is an important part of GMBC community. During our reporting period our churches have resumed in-person Sunday gatherings. We still offer a virtual worship service of Facebook and YouTube for persons who are uncomfortable or unable to attend in-person gatherings.
- **GMBC Biennial Convention** (September 2021) – The M.L. Wilson and Long Creek Baptist Churches served as host churches for our 17th Biennial Convention held September 7-15, 2021, on Zoom, under the theme: *Reviving The Mission, Heeding the Vision: Redeeming The Time – Evangelize! (2 Timothy 4:5)* We were delighted that Rev. Anslem Warrick, Executive Secretary Treasurer of the Caribbean Baptist Fellowship served as our keynote speaker, and Reverend Deno Cartwright, Immediate Past Youth President of Caribbean Baptist Fellowship served as our

revivalist. The GMBC community expresses deepest appreciation to our host Pastor Winston D. Garner and Pastor Oniqueca Grenado and their congregations for their outstanding leadership.

- **Annual Joint Communion** (December 2021) Our Clergy Council collaborated with the M.L. Wilson Baptist Church to host our Annual Joint Communion Service. The Reverend Antony Trufant, Senior Pastor of the Emanuel Baptist Church, Brooklyn, NY, served as the Keynote Preacher. This was a virtual event on Zoom.
- **GMBC Annual Women’s Conference** (March 2022) GMBC Women in God’s Service (WINGS) hosted their 5th Annual Women’s Empowerment Conference under the theme: *Redeeming The Time #BreaktheBias* (Galatians 6:9). The Reverend Merlyn Hyde-Riley, Acting General Secretary of the Jamaica Baptist Union served as Keynote Preacher. Other conference speakers and presenters included Dr. Pinky-Ann Noble Britton, Ph.D., Associate Professor and Program Director in the School of Nursing at Tennessee State University; Ms. Karlene Edwards Warrick, M.B.A., President of Caribbean Baptist Women’s Union; Ms. Tashia James, M. Soc. Sc., Health Education Officer with the Ministry of Health; Ms. Nathalie Harding London, Women Ministry Mentor, Long Island, NY; and Ms. Onya Sam Yearwood, Education Consultant, Georgetown, Guyana. We thank God for sending us these brilliant, godly women. We applaud their ministry amongst us that served as inspiration and encouragement for our WINGS ministry’s ongoing quest for gender equality in the world, which remains one of the greatest global challenges of the 21st century. The GMBC community expresses deepest appreciation to Deacon Donnette Daniels Franco, President of the GMBC Women’s Council, and other members of the GMBC Women’s Council who, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, worked arduously to ensure each participant experienced the flourishing of fruit and faith. This was a virtual event hosted on Zoom.
- **GMBC Annual Sunday School Bible Bowl** (April 2022) This year our Youth Council hosted the Annual Bible Bowl at the Yarrowkabra Baptist Church. It was indeed a joy for our children and young people from various congregations to gather for learning, fun and fellowship. We are grateful to the Youth Council, Sunday School teachers and coaches who spend time preparing the entire Sunday school department, and thus

ensure children and youth continue to grow in faith and knowledge.

Care — GMBC continues to minister to individuals, families, and to the larger communities we serve. We believe each member in our family of faith should be cherished, supported and encouraged in their Christian walk. As a church community we demonstrate care by providing life-long spiritual learning opportunities, prayer support, Christian counseling, and scholarship support for students perusing tertiary education.

- **Bible Studies** – When believers meet to study God’s word together, they foster accountability, connection, encouragement, and unconditional love. Such an environment also promotes spiritual growth and helps believers to put biblical precepts into practice. We utilize the Adult Christian education materials from the Caribbean Christian Publications for Bible studies which continue weekly on various social media platforms. Our congregations with no or very limited internet access are hosting their bible studies on Sundays immediately before worship service.
- **Prayer Gatherings** – When we take time to pray for and with God’s people, we can listen to the Holy Spirit and see God working in real people during real life circumstances. Prayer meetings continue to be virtual events on *What’s App* and Zoom. Pastors and deacons also visit homes and hospitals to pray with families as needed.
- **Sunday School** – All our congregations have resumed in-person Sunday School gatherings. We continue to utilize Christian education materials from the Caribbean Christian Publications for our Sunday school program.
- **Erma Miller Scholarship** – provides personal and direct care to students taking the next big step in tertiary education. This year scholars included:
 - o Tamara Scott, Sociology Student, University of Guyana.

Compassion — Guided by Exodus 34:6, we understand compassion is constitutive of God's very being. We further understand that ministries of compassion must affirm the Image of God in the people we serve. Hence, we work hard to ensure that various mission outreach projects help affirm the dignity of the people we serve. During the year in review, we joined our partners at the Ministry of Public Health, Food for the Poor, and the Ministry of Education to address health disparities, food insecurities, and educational disparities in the communities we serve.

- **The A. Carlyle Miller Health Center and Cottage Hospital** – this facility continues to provide invaluable service to people of Long Creek and its environs. This clinic offers stellar service in maternal and child health. This clinic is also providing general primary care services for patients. We give God thanks for the medical team and are grateful for their hard work and committed service.
- **GMBC Learning Clubs** continue to provide academic support for primary and high school children that were preparing for our national and regional exams. These clubs have resumed meeting in person. In addition to academic support these clubs also provide nutritious snacks for participants.
- **Thursdays in Black** – GMBC continues to support the World Council of Churches (WCC) Thursdays in Black Campaign that seeks to stop gender-based violence (GBV) through advocacy and education. GMBC Leaders and congregants are encouraged to show support by doing the following: wearing Black on Thursdays; using social media platform on Thursdays to speak up and out about GBV; educating persons about GBV through sermons, and Bible studies; working collaboratively with national agencies to support victims of GBV; empowering victims and their support networks to report perpetrators to relevant authorities; encouraging perpetrators to seek professional help.

In September 2021 we hosted a march and rally, and a Thursdays in Black Education Forum. The march took place in Georgetown and the forum was hosted as a virtual event on Zoom. Presenters at this forum were Rev. Nicole Ashwood, Program Executive of the Just Community for Men & Women from the World Council of Churches. Her presentation provided historical background for the Thursday in Black Campaign. She also shared examples of how this campaign continues to make a difference around the world. Other presenters at this forum were as follows: Mr. Colin Marks, Director of Help & Shelter who addressed *Effects of*

Gender Based Violence on Children & Youth; Rev. Geary Reid, Pastor and Author, addressed *Intimate Partner Violence: Men as Victims and Perpetrators*; Dr. Anesia Moore-Thorne, Family Medicine Practitioner, shared about Mental and Psychological Effects of Gender-based Violence.

- **Breast Cancer Awareness** – GMBC WINGS hosted its 3rd annual breast cancer awareness forum. Our keynote speaker was Dr. Deborah B. Johnson, MD, Internist, Cone Health Community Health & Wellness Center, Greensboro, NC. Her presentation was very informative. She also used the opportunity to encourage participants make getting their breast cancer screenings a personal priority.
- **Food Distribution Centers** – GMBC congregations continue to serve as distribution centers for Guyana's Food for the Poor. We provide food hampers, clothing, school supplies, and household items for families in the communities where GMBC churches are located. Abrams Creek Baptist church is extremely grateful to the Bethlehem Baptist Church in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, for supporting its the food and nutrition program at Abrams Creek. Each month more than 50 persons receive hampers with essential food supplies.

Generosity — The psalmist tells us that “The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it...” At GMBC we understand that God owns everything, and humanity is called to be responsible managers of what belongs to God according to God's desires and purposes. We therefore strive to be faithful and generous stewards of all the resources, abilities, and opportunities God has placed in our care.

- **Membership** – GMBC values every soul God has placed in our care. Therefore, under the leading of the Holy Spirit, we continue to invest time and resources to ensure the holistic development of the person.
- **Partnership** – GMBC is grateful for its various partnerships. These partnerships are mutually beneficial to all participants since they unify and strengthen our Christian witness.
 - o **Lott Carey** – We are grateful to the Global Lott Carey family for your partnership through the years. Our partnership promotes a unified Christian witness and provides unique opportunities for Lott Carey global family to learn from, encourage, support, and inspire each other for kingdom building. We are

grateful that a wide cross section of GMBC members were able to participate in the Lott Carey's 124th Annual Session because these sessions were available through various social media platforms.

- o **Ministry of Public Health** – we are grateful for the ongoing partnership with the Guyana Ministry of Public Health at the A. Carlyle Miller Clinic. Because of this partnership thousands of persons receive quality health care benefits.
- o **Imago Dei Leadership Development Center Inc.** (Imago Dei) – We express thanks to churches and persons in the Imago Dei networks for supporting GMBC special projects. This partnership has helped to sustain Camp Somerville, and our Christian education program.

Greetings to you in the precious name of our Lord
and Saviour, Jesus Christ.



Another year has passed, with the COVID-19 pandemic gripping India and most parts of the world. It was a great leveller, striking both the rich and the poor. We have lost countless numbers of citizens. Many children have been left as orphans and numerous households

have lost their breadwinners. We thank the Lord for guiding us through these tough times and protecting us under His strong arms. Many of our staff were also infected with the disease, and some of them succumbed to it. Our medical work amongst the poor and needy was severely affected and our schools were closed. The children had to depend on online classes and staff members valiantly ensured that they did their very best to teach their students, look after their homes and cope with the illness striking them and their families as well. The Lord was with us and carried us victoriously through these times of uncertainty and pain. To Him be all the glory and praise!

The Lott Carey Convention USA, started its work in India during the last half of the 1940s. Eight decades of help and support for the fledgling

prayer group which started in Delhi bore fruit and by the grace of God, it has grown to be an organization which employs more than a thousand people and imparts education to more than ten thousand students, apart from managing clinics in six leprosy colonies. Additionally, we now run seven non-formal education projects for children from marginalised sections of the community. We also support an HIV/AIDS awareness program. We render monetary assistance to more than 160 poor children and nursing students for their education in different educational institutions and pay their hostel expenses as well. We give financial aid to hundreds of poor and needy people from all sections of society in order to enable them to start small income-producing units. We help the sick at our clinics and take care of their hospital expenditures as well. At this time there are 12 churches and three prayer groups sponsored by us which have the potential to grow into full-fledged churches in future.

Rev. J. H. Nelson, Rev. Dr. Abner Frank Nelson and Dr. (Mrs.) Ivy Frey Nelson, founders of this Mission in India, could never have imagined that their faith and initiative in starting projects in a humble way would lead to such an exponential growth. We are grateful for the prayers and financial support of our brothers and sisters in the Lord, of the Lott Carey Convention, USA without which all that we have accomplished would not have been possible. We gratefully remember their large-hearted support from meagre resources for their brothers and sisters in the Lord across the globe. May our Lord bless the Lott Carey Convention USA richly for their untiring support for people whom they have never ever seen.

Preaching, Teaching and Healing ministries still remain our main focus as they did in the past.

As mentioned earlier, COVID-19 has taken a heavy toll on human lives and resources during this period. Yet our dedicated staff have proved their worth, be it in the field of education, church ministry and/or healing ministry. Many of our projects were hampered due to this dreaded pandemic, but by the grace of God, we are slowly coming back to normal. Please do keep us in your prayers as we keep you in our prayers.

Here is a brief summary of the accomplishments of the Lott Carey Baptist Mission in India:

1. The Ministry of Preaching

During the report year, two more churches, Cornerstone Baptist Church, Ghaziabad, Uttar

Pradesh, and Emmanuel Baptist Church, Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh, were added to the 11 existing churches. We praise the Lord for blessing us with these places of worship. Now we have 13 churches, including the house church at Bulandshahr, U.P. Recently we have purchased a 330 square meter plot at Bulandshahr for the construction of a church building.

Details of our churches and prayer groups are given below.

1. Abner Nelson Memorial First Baptist Church, Anandgram, Shahdra, Delhi

Established: 1960. Pastor: Rev. C. V. Valson
Members: 280 from 90 families. Sunday School: 75 children Youth Empowerment Programme: Conducted on 23rd April 2022. 92 youth attended. Vacation Bible School: May 27-29, 2022, 204 children attended the Bible School. Gospel Convention: Gospel Convention was held in on 20th and 21st November 2021 attended by 400 people from various leprosy colonies and churches, which was a great blessing and turned many souls to the Lord.

2. Union Church, 5, Ansari Road, Daryaganj, New Delhi.

Established: 1967 Pastor: Rev. Joel Jagdish Prem Members: 400 from 96 families. Sunday School: 20 children

In 1967, the Secretary/Treasurer of Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention, Rev. Dr. W. C. Somerville laid the foundation stone of this church, which is adjacent to our Headquarters in Daryaganj, Delhi.

3. Lott Carey Baptist Mission Church, Indira Chakraborty Gram, (Leprosy Colony), Hapur Road, Karnal, Haryana

Established: 1970 Pastor: Rev. Samson Sagar Members: 46. Sunday School: 38 children Vacation Bible School: Not held due to COVID-19. The Gospel Convention was not held due to COVID-19. An online Gospel Convention was held the church at Anandgram Leprosy Colony, in which the church members of Karnal and other churches participated. Rev. Dr. A. F. Nelson and his wife, Dr. Mrs. Ivy Frey Nelson, were the founders of this church.

4. Bethany Baptist Church, Bethany Leprosy Colony, Gannaur, Haryana

Established: 2013 Pastor: Rev. C. V. Valson Evangelist: Lazar Members: 95 from 30 families. Sunday School: 23 children VBS: Not conducted

due to COVID-19. The members attended the online Gospel Convention due to COVID-19 restrictions.

5. Mount Olivet Baptist Church, Gharounda, Haryana

Established: 2016 Evangelist: Arjun Singh Members: 50 from 15 families.

Sunday school: 15 children The members attended the online Gospel Convention due to COVID-19 restrictions.

6. Ebenezer Baptist Church, Sadabad, Agra, Uttar Pradesh

Established: 2018 Evangelist: Mr. Mukesh Members: 30 from 10 families. Sunday School: 10 children (Not held due to pandemic)VBS: Not held due to COVID-19. At present the church services are being held in the house of Evangelist Mukesh. This house was renovated and expanded by the Mission. We purchased an excellent plot of land near the church and are waiting for the pandemic to be over to start the construction of a proper building for our Non-formal Education Project. The same premises can be used as a church on Sundays.

7. Mount Sinai Baptist Church, Panipat, Haryana

Established 2019 Evangelist: Lazar Members: 50 from 14 families.

The newly constructed church building at Panipat is expected to be inaugurated in August 2022. Please pray for this church and its many needs.

8. Bethel Baptist Church, Faridabad, Haryana

Established: 2019 Evangelist: Anumant Appa Members: 60 from 20 families. Sunday School: 20 children attend. The old clinic building was renovated and converted into a prayer hall and the inauguration of the building was held on 19th March 2022.

9. St. Thomas Baptist Church, Village Ladhiyapur, Ballabgarh, Haryana

Established: in 2020 as a House Church Evangelist: Prashant Masih

Number of Members: 30 from 10 families Though small in numbers, the members are earnest and happy to have a roof under which they are able to gather and Praise the Lord.

10. Nazareth Baptist Church, Village Dabwali, Bhatinda, Punjab (House Church)

Established: 2020 as House Church Evangelist: Manoj Masih Members: 30 from 11 families.

11. Trinity Baptist Church, Village Kunjpura, Newal, Haryana

Established: 2020 as House Church Evangelist: Arjun Singh Members: 15. Worship services are held once in a month.

Prayer groups, with potential to become churches in future:

- a) Prayer Group at Bapoli, in Panipat, Haryana, Strength: 35; Evangelist: Mr. Arjun Singh conducts the prayer meetings.
- b) Prayer Group at Dhadlana, Panipat, Haryana. Strength: 30; Rev. Vikas Singh conducts the prayer meetings.
- c) The Prayer Group at Mursan, in Uttar Pradesh. About 25 people attend the prayer group. Evangelist Mukesh Kumar is taking care of the flock.

Regular Meetings of Prayer Groups could not be held due to COVID restrictions; however, online services were regularly held wherever possible.

2. Ministry of Teaching

The Mission has the following seven non-formal education projects in the states of Delhi, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh:

a) Little Children's Montessori Base Primary School, Meerut, Uttar Pradesh

Established: 1950 Principal: Miss Dolly Lal Number of children: 108 – Nursery to Class V

Teaching Staff: 5; Others: 3

The school, which is fully supported by the Mission, is located in Meerut, Uttar Pradesh. This is the first non-formal school for poor children established by the Mission in 1950.

b) Somerville Non-formal Education Project, Amar Nagar, Faridabad, Haryana

Established: 2006 Teacher in charge: Mrs. Anima Kandulna Number of children: 30

This school is exclusively for the children of migrant quarry workers residing in the locality. The students are admitted to the local government-run schools after receiving primary education at this project. Our doctor visits the school once in a week to give medical support. The parents of the children are extremely poor

and can hardly afford to give their children a decent meal every day. The pandemic affected these poor children the most. Neither could they attend school, nor could they afford to buy smart phones to facilitate online classes. They missed out on having regular classes for almost two years.

c) Somerville Non-formal School, Anandgram Leprosy Colony, Shahdra, Delhi

Established: 2014 Number of children: 65 in Nursery and Kindergarten

Staff: Teaching 2, Others 1 The classes are held on the 2nd floor of the church building.

d) Somerville Pre-School at Bethany Baptist Church, Gannaur, Haryana

Established: 2017 Number of children: 40 in Nursery and Kindergarten classes

Staff: Teaching 1, Others 2 The first floor of the church in the leprosy colony is for this school, which is administered by Pastor Lazar Masih, with the help of an assistant.

e) Somerville Pre-School at Mount Olivet Baptist Church, Gharounda, Haryana

Established: 2017 Number of children: 10 in Nursery Staff: Teaching 1, Others 1

f) Somerville Non-Formal Education Project & Vocational Training Centre, Karnal.

Established: 2022 Staff: Teaching 2, Other: 1 Number of students: 11 Trainees: 5

This is the latest project of the Mission established to impart vocational training to ladies. Activities include stitching and tailoring of garments. An experienced teacher has been employed for this purpose. The ladies who attend these classes are eager to learn so as to start their own small scale tailoring units. We have supplied 4 sewing machines to the centre and at present five ladies are availing this opportunity. The school hours for the children are in the morning where 11 students are taught and after that the vocational training centre meets in the afternoon.

g) The Ankur Project held at Somerville School, NOIDA, after regular school hours in partnership with Army, Navy, Air Force Wives Activity Trust (ANAWA Trust).

The meaning of the word Ankur in Hindi is Sprout or Seedling. Through this project, in partnership with a charitable organisation of the wives of military officers, the LCBM in

India serves around 400 children from slums and nearby villages in NOIDA. Our Mission has provided the required class rooms and transportation for these marginalised children from slum colonies. After the pandemic subsided, regular classes have been restarted.

h) Scholarships and Financial Aid to Poor and Needy

The education and hostel expenses of approximately 153 students were supported by the Mission during the reporting year. Five of these students received training in nursing courses. The Mission provides financial aid to many poor and needy persons, be it for medical treatment or setting up small scale business ventures so that they can feed their families.

Public Schools of the Mission

The Mission has four public schools affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education. These schools are well known for their academic excellence and discipline, and for instilling the right values in young minds. The children are mainly from middle and upper middle class families in and around Delhi. The total strength of the four schools is nearly 10,000. The schools are financially self-supporting. Since April 2020, the schools were closed except for the school office, and online teaching was done for all classes. We have restarted regular classes and students are attending at full strength. All thanks and praise be to the Lord.

a) Somerville School, Vasundhara Enclave, Delhi-110096

From a humble beginning in 1975 with just over 400 students in a central Delhi building, we have come a long way, with nearly 2700 students on our rolls and an excellent school building with state of the art class rooms. The Lord is good. We have restarted regular classes and children are attending classes at full strength

b) Somerville School, NOIDA, Uttar Pradesh.

Students: 3318 **Teaching staff:** 150 **Admin staff:** 166

Established in 1987, the school is known as

one of the best schools in the National Capital Region. The school is widely recognized for its academic excellence and extra-curricular activities. The Principal of the school is Mrs. Margarita Nalini Arulraj. We have restarted regular classes and children are attending classes at full strength.

c) Somerville School, Greater NOIDA, Uttar Pradesh

Students: 1930 **Teaching staff:** 99 **Admin staff:** 108

The school has completed 24 years since its inception. During two successive years the school had 100% first divisions, with more than 80% Distinctions and no second division, third division or failures. This school has the distinction of being the first established school in Greater NOIDA, Uttar Pradesh. We have restarted regular classes and children are attending classes in full strength. Dr. Mary Thomas is the Principal of the school.

d) Somerville International School, Sect. 132, NOIDA UP

Students: 84 **Teaching staff:** 55 **Admin staff:** 87

This is the ninth year since the school started functioning. The total capacity of this school is nearly 4000, however, being a new school, the student strength is much less than the capacity. We have restarted regular classes and children are attending classes in full strength. The school is fully air-conditioned and each class has been provided air purifiers. Dr Gregory K. Moss Sr., former President of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention, blessed the school building in November 2012, in the presence of the former Executive Secretary/Treasurer of Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention, Dr David Emmanuel Goatley. Miss Marilyn Thomas is the Officiating Principal of the school.

Involvement of Somerville School Students in Social Work

Monthly food rations are given to nearly 30 families of HIV/AIDS patients by the school children of Somerville School, Vasundhara Enclave. Further, the school supplies food and other essential items on a monthly basis, to a nearby Christian orphanage which is a considerable help to its 150 inmates. During the

Christmas season, our students collect various gift items and present them to the children of our Non-formal education projects, who are from the economically marginalized communities of the society, thus students from Somerville School are engaging in community welfare work from an early age.

3. Ministry of Healing

a) HIV/AIDS awareness project

Though we had started a mini hospital with 7 beds for HIV/AIDS in/out patients in 2006, we had to close it down in 2015 due to an increase in the number of patients, and financial limitations. Since then, we have been running an HIV/AIDS Awareness Programme to control the spread of the disease in the society, especially among the economically disenfranchised classes of the community. Awareness is spread through magic shows and street plays conducted every week and local people attend these shows.

b) Leprosy Clinics administered by the Mission and Year Clinic Established

1. Lott Carey Baptist Mission Hospital, Indira Chakraborty Gram, Karnal, Haryana. 1970
2. Dr. Ivy Nelson Memorial Leprosy Clinic, Bharat Mata Kusht Ashram, Gandhi Colony, Faridabad, Haryana. 1970
3. Lott Carey Baptist Mission Clinic, Navjeevan Leprosy Colony, Vaikunt Dham, Panipat, Haryana. 1984
4. Lott Carey Baptist Mission Clinic, Navjyoti Leprosy Association, Udyog Nagar, Mangolpuri, Delhi. 1985
5. Gandhi Kusht Ashram, Hissar Road, Rohtak, Haryana. 1985
6. Dr. Beverly Scott Memorial Clinic, Bethany Leprosy Colony, Gannaur, Haryana. 2013
7. Clinic at Anandgram Leprosy Colony, Shahdra, Delhi. Established 2014

When I joined Lott Carey Baptist Mission in 1975, there were hardly any medicines/treatment for this dreaded disease. Since then there has been amazing progress in the field of leprosy treatment, and powerful antibiotics are available which can arrest the spread of the disease within a maximum two years. Timely treatment prevents deformities and the patients can be brought back to the main stream so that they can carry on with their daily activities

without any social ostracization. Dr. P. K. Tyagi and Dr. Virender Atreja, our faithful and willing doctors, attend to patients in the leprosy clinics. They also treat general diseases of poor people from the surrounding areas.

c) Mobile Clinics

The needs of nearly 7000 patients are attended to by our Mobile Clinic services. These clinics have made a tremendous impact on the lives of the poorest of the poor in the area, especially those who cannot even afford travel expenses to reach the nearest government-run hospitals. These mobile clinics take the doctors to the areas where they live. Thousands of lives have been saved by these clinics. Dr. P. K. Tyagi, who has been in our service for more than 40 years, is the driving force behind this project.

Actions speak louder than words, and our selfless community service is appreciated by all sections of society. We give value-oriented free education to the poorest of the poor in the society through our Non-Formal Education Projects.

It is only through the grace of the Lord, and prayers and support of the members of the Lott Carey Convention, USA, that we have been able to carry out these manifold activities. Though I joined the Mission in 1975 and took over as Superintendent only in 2012, the Lord has used me as an instrument in His hand to bring Good News to people who are living in darkness. The number of churches since 2012 has increased from three to thirteen, and the number of prayer groups have increased to three. The main driving force behind this increase in evangelization is Rev. C. V. Valson, who joined the Mission in 1993, and the Lord enabled him to become a Pastor of the Mission in 2006. It is incredible how the Good Lord works through him to expand His Kingdom and bring the Good News to thousands of people in this country.

We beseech the prayer and support of our brothers and sisters of the Convention to carry this work forward and we shall always remain grateful for your care and support for unseen brothers and sisters in India. Please pray for our country with 1.4 billion people, where a substantial number of them live below poverty line. Our government is doing its best; however, the sheer numbers of the population make it a very difficult task. Please pray for our country so that the marginalised sections of the society can come out of the mire of poverty.

We have some special needs, which include church buildings in 1) Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh and 2)

Sadabad, Dist Hathras, Uttar Pradesh. By the grace of God, we were able to procure land in these areas, but we are short of funds and unable to construct even a small place of worship in these two places. Please pray for this urgent need of the Mission.

I take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Mary George, President of the Lott Carey Baptist Mission in India, and Mrs. D. A. Tressler, Chairperson/Director of Somerville Schools, for the excellent support and motivation received from them. I am extremely grateful for their valuable cooperation and suggestions for the betterment of the Mission. Special thanks go out to the Manager of our schools Mr. Abraham Mathew, principals of our schools, doctors of the leprosy colonies, Pastors of the churches, and my colleagues and staff, without whose help, the Mission could not have made such steady progress in various fields.

The Trinity Evangelical Ministry (TEM) greets the Lott Carey Foreign Mission family during this 125th Annual Session. We join with the global family in celebrating the joys of the past year, while sharing in the challenges and difficult moments experienced by

many across the globe given the harsh impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic. We extend special greetings to the Chairman, Rev. Dr. John Alexander, President, Rev. Dr. Gina Stewart and the Executive Secretary/Treasurer, Rev. Emmett Dunn.

The ministry of TEM is firmly rooted in the understanding of Jesus's mission and ministry. Its founder, Pastor George Coore, strongly believed in the great commission and sought every opportunity to spread the gospel. He saw the Gospel as God's desire for humanity to experience wholeness: therefore, the ministry was community-based and was geared toward the most vulnerable. With very little resources, Pastor Coore set out securing land and constructing classrooms, trusting that by faith the environment would be created for education and training, both in Christian discipleship and in the education of children and youth.

Our partnership with Lott Carey continues to be vitally important as it underscores the global nature of mission and the value of relationships and partnerships that bear the features of mutuality and equity as we fulfil the mandate of Jesus Christ. It is our prayer that the perspectives of the south, through the facilitation of the Lott Carey network, will continue to positively impact the missional insights and paradigms of the north.

Over the past year TEM continued to give focus to two main areas:

1. Early Childhood Education
2. Skills Training

Early Childhood Education was offered to thirty-five children, ages 3-6. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic it became extremely challenging to provide educational opportunities for children in this age cohort as face-to-face schooling was prohibited for a significant portion of the school year. During this period attempts were made to engage the children using creative methods. Parental involvement became even more critical as we relied on parents to give oversight to the completion of tasks by providing printed materials, *What's App* engagement and brief periods of online interaction.

Thankfully, face to face schooling was possible for two of the three school terms. The children returned to school and were able to fully engage in age-appropriate curriculum, which included play, an element which was missing during the no-contact phase of schooling. Eight students graduated (4 boys and 4 girls) and will move into the primary phase of their education. We look forward to welcoming new students in the coming weeks as the new school year commences September 2022. We are extremely grateful to Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Clifford Jones for the significant sponsorship provided through Lott Carey, which has kept the school going.

The Skills Training Centre was also greatly challenged by COVID-19 as the training courses offered are practical courses requiring face to face engagement. Notwithstanding, we celebrate the fact that we were able to train 66 young adults in the areas of Commercial Food Preparation, Early Childhood Development and Food and Beverage Restaurant Hosting. The number of trainees was less than usual but the circumstance of the times affected recruitment efforts. An additional course offering: Allied Health is pending. TEM continues to ensure that the courses offered are relevant and responsive to the current needs of the employees ensuring the

possibility of employment after the completion of the training programme.

The value of education can never be underestimated, and TEM has been impacting generations of families by providing nurturing and early formation of young children and a second chance to young adults who, for various reasons, need a skill to make it possible for them to become employable, and to care for themselves and families.

The opportunities for funding/investing in TEM are many. Both the Skills Training Centre and the Basic School need additional desks and chairs for teachers and students. With use, these fall into disrepair and need to be replaced. The Skills Training Centre

has also been without computers for the use of the students for some time and this has restricted the offering of some courses with heavy reliance on computers. There is also need for other training equipment and infrastructural work.

We are thankful to God for the generosity of the individuals, churches and friends of Lott Carey. The impact made by the sharing of your resources is not easily quantified. We are grateful for the partnership and the spirit of engagement and thank you for your prayers and assure you of ours.

service with them.

We look forward to many years of fruitful impactful and rewarding ministry with them.

SHORT HISTORY OF LOTT CAREY MINISTRY IN KENYA

Rev. Hezron Cheruiyot was introduced by a friend to Dr. Sommerville, then secretary /treasurer of Lott Carey, in 1983 when Cheruiyot was a post graduate at the Bowie State College for business administration. He graduated from Washington Bible College and Capitol Bible Seminary in 1982. Upon Rev. Cheruiyot's graduation in May 1985, Dr. Sommerville commissioned him to go back to Kenya and commence work amongst his people. The Lott Carey work began fully in Kenya in 1986. Lott Carey, USA assisted in the operation of a secondary school in Barotian in Londiani division of Kericho district 1986-1992. The school was discontinued due to government interference and local political interests. In May 1992 Lott Carey Ministries, Kenya embarked on evangelism and church planting. The achievements of this work have been elaborately documented from

the onset to the present.

God has truly blessed the works of our hands. We are grateful for the fruitfulness of those who have tirelessly labored with us.

THE THRUST OF LOTT CAREY WORK IN KENYA

The primary work of the Lott Carey ministries in Kenya includes: evangelism, church planting, medical provisions, caring for orphans and widows, agriculture, education, water and advocacy.

The objectives are as follows:

- a) To promote the Kingdom of God on earth through preaching, teaching, humanitarian assistance and observing all God's instructions for life – Mathew 28:18-20.
- b) To promote and enhance human development through community work, e.g. medicines, water, economic empowerment and relief – 1 Thessalonians 4:1-2
- c) To create development models in education, agriculture and advocacy
- d) To attempt whenever possible to assist the community in the alleviation of hunger and poverty by employing modern technology in agriculture, provision of seeds and sourcing for viable markets
- e) To be a voice to the voiceless by promoting social justice and gender equity
- f) To encourage dialogue amongst the diverse communities (tribes) in our country by preaching peace and cohesive assistance

IMPACT

There are four visible areas that are distinct to our ministry.

1. **Spiritual** Currently, we have more than 4000 members in 33 congregations. This illustrates the efforts and effectiveness of our ministry. Our concerted programs in evangelism, church preaching and community development have borne tremendous fruits. Our dedication to the work of God in all spheres has changed lives.
2. **Social** The Lott Carey ministry in Kenya has participated in conflict resolutions e.g. tribal wars, gender parities, ethnic discriminations, and stereotypes. As a ministry, we have not hesitated to send our pastors to volatile area of

tribal animosities to dissuade warring communities in Pokot, Turkana, Samburu and Baringo from engaging in destructive acts.

3. **Education** We have contributed time, knowledge and monies to educational endeavors. We have used coffee proceeds to pay school fees for orphans and several secondary school-age children. We have also participated in fundraising activities to enable many university students to achieve their dreams.

4. **Economic** The five acres of coffee have truly demonstrated to our church members that the “church is not just for preaching, but also for doing.” From the coffee proceeds, we have paid our pastors’ medical bills for our sick members and immensely contributed to the needy in the community. We have sponsored social, educational and communal events that promote a peaceful coexistence. Many of our members have benefited from the coffee proceeds. We sustain our sister ministry in Bor, South Sudan through the monies from the coffee. Many of our pastors, laymen and members benefit from our coffee.

It is our wish, therefore, to increase the acreage of our coffee plantation to 20 acres so as to enlarge the volume of beneficiaries. We envision a 20-acre plantation will yield 16,000 kilos of coffee; thus, giving us an approximate amount of KSH: 1,920,000/= \$17,143. This will go a long way in uplifting our church, family, community and our constituent work in South Sudan.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

The Kipsitet Baptist Clinic has offered medical Health Services to the vast areas of Kipsitet and neighbouring counties. We thank the Maple Spring Baptist Church, Capital Heights, MD, and the Nevertheless Outreach Ministry in Washington, DC, for their tireless continuous support in replenishing the clinic with medicine.

We would like to do more in community development. We sincerely thank our partners in USA for supporting two boreholes in Kipsitet and Kipchorian. We now pump 5000 liters of water a month to our Kipsitet residents. The Kipchorian well did not succeed, but we are grateful for the tireless efforts of Rev. Bernard Taylor of Open Doors Baptist Church, retired Rev. John

Rhodes of Trinidad Baptist Church and Rev. Maxwell Washington of St. Mathews Baptist Church.

We would like to do more wells for the communities in the next 1-3 years. Additionally, we wish to expand evangelism and church planting works. We aim at increasing congregational membership totals from current 4000 to 5000, and to expand from 33 churches to 40 churches. We will also endeavor to do more in supporting orphans, widows and women. The need is real and greater on these areas.

Kipsitet Empowerment Center has offered training on tailoring and hairdressing for close to 50 women in the last two years; 24 of these women and young mothers have successfully graduated with certificates.

Some of the young mothers and girls are being offered basic training on computer packages a 6-month program. New recruits commence at the end of the sixth month. We sincerely thank the WISE Women of Lott Carey, Baptist Women of Virginia and other partners.

PRAYERS

We solicit prayers from partners in the USA and globally for expansion of our work to the greater lake regions e.g. DRC, Eastern Uganda, and Western South Sudan. We want to do more on our evangelistic work, church planting and humanitarian work. Pray for the purchase of motorcycles for 5 pastors and 20 bicycles for our laymen. We require support for many of our needy orphans, widows and single mothers.

Last but not least, Kenya goes into presidential elections August 9, 2022. The potential for another acrimonious vote is real. Many will recall the tribal clashes witnessed in 2007. The same is true this year.

We ask for your prayers and increased financial support for all the above.

We offer sincere thanks and appreciation for your sustained and very generous support for our work and ministry here in Liberia amidst the global economic hardships we continue to experience and endure. We are thankful for the "loaves and fishes" you share with us, and for which we give thanks daily, sharing with those all around us. We are also thankful for prayer support you continue to offer

for our concerns and needs. We pray the Lord will continue to abundantly bless you even as you have been and continue to be a blessing to us and many others.

Since the founding of this Institution (Lott Carey Baptist Mission Schools, Brewerville and Bopolu campuses), our singular focus has always been to provide the best quality education for academic excellence in a disciplined, safe, caring and nurturing environment.

The cadre of students this institution has sent forth from its sacred walls over the years, who are now contributing meaningfully to the development of their communities, our nation and the world, are true ambassadors representing our institution's values. Our enrollment for this academic school year stands as follows: LCM Brewerville campus, 353 students (198 female and 155 male); and at the Bopolu Campus, 234 students (99 female and 144 male).

Our core work as an educational institution (Nursery through 12th grade) is even more important now, as we march on in advancing the work of the kingdom by "**touching lives with transforming love**" through the nurturing and molding of young minds by providing a robust and sustained quality education here in Liberia. Our watchword is scholarship at the highest level, and a place where we build character needed for a vibrant, productive and wholesome society. We do education with a Christian emphasis.

At LCM, certain core values help shape who we are and affects our goals of how we minister throughout our community:

Spiritual Emphasis Spiritual emphasis is the foundation and the core of our work to affect the whole person – spiritually, academically and recreationally. The spiritual emphasis is through daily devotions, vespers, Bible clubs, Bible teaching, being examples for the students to see, and other activities and programs that help steer and influence their development as whole persons. We also have a unique opportunity to be a witness to students who are Muslims and of other faiths.

Academic Excellence continues to be the hallmark of this institution as is so succinctly stated in our school's motto, "**Character, Industry, and Scholarship**". Both of our campuses (Brewerville and Bopolu) provide unique opportunities to

students in these and surrounding communities to access and achieve the very best in academic excellence available at a very minimal or minuscule fee compared to other institutions. Our work in Gbarpolu County over the past sixty years is an oasis through education and preaching of the gospel of Christ. The outstanding academic performance of our students transferring to other schools, coupled with the desire of our teachers to serve humanity are testimonies of our relevance to our people and country. The students do practical work and experiments in the laboratory. We need to continuously upgrade our laboratories to be more functional for the benefit of our students.

Our students are utilizing the school's library for research and reading assignments. A reading program in the elementary division encourages our students to check out books to read at home with their parents.

Computer education is a part of our core curriculum, offering every student, grades 4 through 12, the opportunity to become computer literate. **We are very grateful to Dr. Howard John Wesley and the Alfred Street Baptist Church family, Alexandria, Virginia,** for generously donating 40 brand new Microsoft laptops, enabling us to have a fully functional computer lab. Recently female students from grades 6, 7, and 8 had a very exciting and informative class session. Interacting with students from Metropolitan Baptist Church School, Washington, DC.

Our goal is to develop a smart campus, enabling our students to interact with students from other schools all over the world.

We also want to thank **Metropolitan Baptist Church** for sending us eight brand new Lenovo laptops and 2 Digital Projectors which are used in the Teachers' Resource Center for lesson preparation, research, and ton input and upload students' grades. **Thanks to International Ministries, American Baptist Churches** for grant support which enabled us to relaunch the School's website and a School Management System to facilitate students and parents accessing students' grades online.

Lott Carey Baptist Mission School has distinguished itself as one of the very best educational institutions in our country. Each year scores of students are hoping to enroll in our school. We intentionally

limit and control our enrollment, in order to avoid shortchanging our educational program. Our emphasis is on quality, not quantity. We are doing our best to maintain our class sizes in keeping with internationally acceptable standards. This engenders a better learning environment with more time for teacher-student interaction.

Our students always perform very well on national and regional exams and the school is recognized as one with a very high passing grade of 95% and above.

Our partnership with Lott Carey is very beneficial in many respects. Through this partnership, Lott Carey has maintained a significant and enviable presence here in Liberia for over a century by building an educational institution that provides the very best quality education in a nurturing and wholesome environment. Through this partnership, scores of children and young people have been able to access quality education at a very minimal cost to their families. Many have been beneficiaries of financial aid and scholarships provided by and through Lott Carey churches and families. Some graduates are beneficiaries of scholarships and grants to assist in furthering their education at Tertiary Institutions.

Our partnership is valuable because students are afforded an opportunity to participate in regular spiritual emphasis week with Lott Carey members coming over to serve as speakers, counselors and motivators. This is an essential medium through which we are reaching out with the gospel of Christ to our students with an opportunity for them to make decisions to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Some of our students have been called to the gospel ministry due to their early exposure to the good news of Jesus Christ.

This partnership has given us a rich heritage and legacy as one of the premier Christian Mission Schools in the country over the last 114 years. Most significantly, this partnership has facilitated and enabled meaningful and mutually beneficial relationships between students, faculty, staff on the one hand, and pastors, churches, families and individual Lott Carey members. The bonds forged consistently evolve into endearing, long-term relationships.

Through our partnership with Lott Carey we are able to provide a safe, conducive learning environment, and wholesome educational opportunities for

students as we prepare them to be world citizens. Due to the COVID pandemic and restrictions on travel, we have missed the presence of mission teams on the campuses. We pray and hope as the medical and economic situations improve, we will gladly look forward to receiving and welcoming you back home to the campuses to fellowship, share, and impart with each other.

Our main area of impact is in educating and molding the minds of children and young people as we prepare them to be excellent, brilliant students and well-rounded and productive citizens. We prepare them academically to make their mark in whatever sphere they find themselves. As we develop their minds, we create a wholesome environment for character-forming and character-building. We have watched over the years as they grow from inquisitive little children into mature, critical-thinkers, innovative and creative young people. They are in every sphere of service in the global village – social activists, environmentalists, healthcare practitioners and providers, engineers, legal luminaries, and educators, to name a few. These children came to the bright flame to have their torches lit, and are going out brightening corners and lighting up the world.

We praise God for the brand-new roof on the Nathaniel Tyler-Lloyd Chapel on our Bopolu Campus. Thanks to Rev. Dunn for ensuring the funds were available to complete this very important project. We changed a badly needed roof, and removed the bats infestation in the ceiling.

There are **several mission opportunities/special projects** on campus for which individuals, families, churches, and Sunday school classes can offer prayerful consideration and support:

Among many important projects, there is the on-going concern for **menstrual hygiene**. While this issue is coming to the fore worldwide, over the last ten years, every month is menstrual hygiene month at Lott Carey Baptist Mission Schools. Through the generosity of many Lott Carey Churches, Sunday School classes, mission societies, families and individuals, we have been able to provide free menstrual hygiene products (sanitary pads, new underclothes, washcloths, soaps, creams/lotions) to about 250 female students on both campuses every month. This helps ensure female

students can remain in school throughout the year and do not have to miss school during their cycle. These resources also help minimize infections, and importantly, help build self-confidence. Male students are also taught about menstrual hygiene and to be more considerate and helpful when necessary. These are life lessons for all students.

We are grateful to all of the Lott Carey churches, classes, families, and individuals which have provided these particular supplies and products over the years. You have made a big difference in the lives of students (former and current). Please do not stop sending those valuable supplies. COVID has created a significant shortfall in donated supplies over the last three years. They are needed, and much appreciated.

OTHER PROJECTS

1. Install overhead fans in the classrooms (classrooms are very hot and humid during the long dry season and also during the rainy season). Twenty fans are needed @ US\$145.00 each.
2. To change the blackboards in all classrooms to whiteboards for better visibility and instruction in the classrooms. We need 25 whiteboards @ US\$185.00 each.
3. There is always the need for sanitary supplies, hygiene kits, and underclothes for our students (all ages – male and female).
4. There is also the need for variety of school and teacher supplies, copybooks, pens, pencils, calculators, backpacks/book bags, etc.
5. Our chapel windows and security bars need to be replaced on our main campus at the cost of US\$8,054.26.

Prayer Partnership – we covenant to pray for and with each other. We share with you and covet your daily prayerful support for:

- continued safety, well-being and health of students and their families, staff and their families, especially during this ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic we are still experiencing; for provisions to keep families fed, healthy and well, and to take care of their daily needs.
- financial support and resources to increase so that we can take care of all of our needs as an institution.
- security of our campus. Lately we have been attacked, and our property has been encroached on. We are going through the courts and the legal system to have the encroachers vacate our property. We pray for resources to completely fence in our school property once all legal hurdles have been cleared.
- resources and partners in the development of our agricultural farm, which will help us prepare for a more financially secure and sustained future.
- short-term mission teams to come to Liberia and do VBS, sports camps, STEM camps, Music camps, and Spiritual Emphasis weeks with our students.

We are grateful for this privilege to be of service taking care of the precious lambs entrusted to our care to nurture, care for and protect. We pray that as we strive to be faithful in tending to the lambs entrusted to our care, by God's help we will produce fully grown and developed, useful, productive and valuable sheep.

Thank you to Rev. Emmett L. Dunn and office staff for your encouragement and support during this very difficult period. We pray God's blessings upon you as you lead this beloved institution.

Greetings



Another year has come and gone but we are so grateful for the Divine coverage God granted us.

Here in Nigeria we were spared the projected infection predicted by the World Health Organization concerning the COVID-19

pandemic, which extended into 2021. The strict measures imposed on and taken by the government through its health ministries ensured the spread was kept to a minimum. Presently, we would like to say we are “out of the woods” concerning the pandemic, but we are still observing precautionary measures.

We would like to thank God, for we, here in Lott Carey, did not lose anyone during that period. All Glory is given to our Lord and Savior for his favorable benevolence in this regard.

On behalf of more than 5000 members of the Lott Carey family in Nigeria, my office and I bring you greetings of joy and do pray with you for a successful 125th Annual Session of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention to be held in New Orleans, Louisiana, with the theme *EMBRACE*.

THE CONTEXT OF BIRTH

Sixty-six year ago, in the southern part of Nigeria, Christianity was not completely alien. However, the prevalent religious practice was based on cultural and traditional beliefs of witchcraft, sorcery and idolatry. At that time most, if not all, family compounds had shrines with altars for their territorial deities. Some of the practices were meant to not only control people's

minds with fear, but delayed and even denied people some of these destinies. Some beliefs and practices were focused on the female gender. One example was the practice that no daughter of a family could get married until her senior sister was married. Another was the practice of female genital mutilation, intended to prevent sexual promiscuity. Other practices included the automatic transfer of a wife to a male family member after the death of her family; and, the compulsory initiation of the first born into certain cultic social cultural sects, which would require the child being dedicated to a deity. This in particular involved the drinking of human or animal blood as a sign of committed allegiance to the deity.

Upon the return of the late Rev. Charles Ebong to his community, with his desire to change this restrictive and destructive practice, he established Christian House Fellowships, where the basic Christian principles and beliefs were taught to help liberate people's mindsets from the bondage of harmful traditional beliefs and practices. Eventually these home fellowships grew and spread through other communities. These fellowships marked the beginning of the Baptist Movement in Southern Nigeria.

Years later, Charles Ebong saw the need to establish a secondary school because there was not a single secondary school for high school age children to attend in the surrounding 21 villages of his community. Those who could afford formal education had to walk hours for it was miles to the closest school. And, so he established a school in a more accessible location. The Mission in its earlier years embarked upon aggressive evangelism which led to the spread of the Baptist movement and progressive establishment of over 80 churches and five additional schools in three different states of southern Nigeria.

THE IMPORTANCE OF LOTT CAREY'S MINISTRIES

The existence of Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission in Nigeria is indeed a great manifestation of what Jesus called his followers to do in the Great Commission. Lott Carey Baptist Mission exists as a body sent out into the world to foremost preach the Gospel – the liberating, saving and reconciling good news of Jesus Christ. Therefore, the importance of the Lott Carey Mission in today's context is seen in both teaching and benevolent ministries of the Mission. LCM has helped mold the moral character of the communities and the minds of youth through the different developmental programs offered by educational institutions, preparing them for their future vocational or occupational pursuits.

Lott Carey Baptist Mission in Nigeria does not exist in a vacuum or in isolation. As such, the value of this community-based organization cannot be underestimated. It is a known fact the Lott Carey, Nigeria has established more than 80 churches during its existence in the south-south and southeast geopolitical zones of the country. Where there are churches, the communities stand to benefit socially, economically, morally and spiritually. Our existence has exercised positive influence over the people and the land. Peaceful co-existence is enhancing the communities.

Establishment of dozens of churches and six educational institutions, with the intention of responding to needs and concerns in communities where they've been established, the schools care for children from Nursery to primary and secondary levels of education.

It is worth mentioning that Lott Carey has offered both partial and full scholarships to its pupils despite religious persuasion and ethnicity. Lott Carey instituted a policy of "3-pupils-one-free" scholarship scheme, which has gone a long way to assist parents with more than two pupils in our schools. This is in itself a Christian witness to which the Mission is committed.

MAIN AREAS OF MINISTRY AND IMPACT

Lott Carey's main efforts are in the areas of Evangelism, Education and Humanitarian Services, and are focused in the rural areas of Akwa Ibom, Cross Rivers, Rivers and Taraba States. The establishment of the Taraba field is our first ministry efforts in the North central geographical area of Nigeria.

EVANGELISM

The focal effort of the Nigerian Mission, since her inception, has been the preaching and practice of the gospel with intentions of sharing the message and teaching of Jesus Christ, so as to "renew the minds" of our people and sway them from harmful traditional and cultural religious beliefs and practices. However, due to one thing or another, some of the churches broke away from Lott Carey and became independent Baptist churches. Presently we have about 56 church still worshipping under the auspices of Lott Carey. Over the past year, the evangelism wing of our youth Department has been blessed to established new house fellowships. Helping to sustain our goals and aspirations in this area, the Mission has been blessed with a pastorate of 68 Ministers.

PRAYER BAND

Prayer is the lifeline for any Christian. With this in mind, the Mission has an Intercessory Prayer group which visits different areas of our Mission every other month during which it conducts a 3-day prayer convocation for the area. The group consists of three

delegates from each of the ten fields of the Mission. Not only do they conduct prayer sessions but also raise funds during the services to fund projects being carried out by the host church.

This year God has had a favorable ear for this gathering and many testimonies have been recorded. The most recent was recorded by our publisher/printer who prints all of the Mission materials and stationeries. In April he was diagnosed with a malignant cyst and an operation was scheduled for June 3. His church prayer group submitted his concern to the intercessory group who prayed for him. However, on the arrival on the operation date, the doctor noted the malignant cyst had disappeared completely, and Deacon Smith didn't after all need an operation because the Lord had favored him with healing as a result of the availing fervent prayers of his intercessory prayer group.

EDUCATION

Knowing the importance of education in a developing country, Lott Carey has established schools with Nursery, Primary and Secondary school curricula, as noted above. Other key factors about the establishment of these is schools include

- All of these schools are located in areas where such educational institutions were not accessible. They became the first of its kind in these rural communities.
- The schools have adapted the set down approved state curriculum with a few modifications to ensure a wider range of relevant subjects.
- Participation in extracurricular activities is encouraged, such as debate clubs, mathematics clubs, reading and spelling bee clubs, all of which has widen students' horizons of study.
- As a result, the schools have been performing well during State sponsored external examinations and competitions.

We are equally proud and grateful of our faculty and administration as their presence and contributions to the programs and ministries of education are reflected by these accomplishments:

- five of our present teachers were students here, who pursued their university studies and after graduation came back to teach in the school.
- The principal of the Ikot Ebom Nursery School, John Ismael, is one of such former students and he is performing very well.

These teachers really have passion for the work and have a true sense of belonging hence are very committed. Most importantly, our schools are tuition

friendly and have different kinds of incentives to ensure that every child of school age can be and is in school. All of our students' tuition fees are subsidized by the Mission by 40%.

5. Humanitarian Ministries

- Rehabilitation of “Street boys” Through the Youth Evangelism Team, the Mission is involved with two young men who gave their lives to Christ in September of last year, Jeremiah and Aniedi. They were in rehabilitation programme here in Uyo. Upon their completion, we have assisted them in setting up a small business for them. Their progress is supervised by the office in Uyo.
- Community Widows at Ebong Essien Uyo: Over the years we have been assisting four widows who live in our office community with relief materials which included, clothes, assorted food stuff and medical service.
- Women Empowered Soft Loan Project: The W.I.S.E. Empowerment scheme is still assisting Lott Carey's Women with loans. However, lately due to the economic hardship, a few of them reneged on repaying or have not repaid at all. But generally, we have been hearing of successful stories regarding their progress.
- Educational Conference for Teachers: At the beginning of the academy year, the Mission concluded a four-day refresher course for all of its teaching staff. This was to assist the teachers to improve their teaching skills. The resources persons were from the States Ministry of Education and lecturers from the Department of Education Technology of University of Uyo.
- Pastoral Training Seminars/Conferences: We have conducted two 4-day seminars/conferences for all of our Ministers; one was held in February and other in June, 2022. In addition to this, the Mission is assisting two Ministers with their theological studies in the University of Uyo.

1. INTRODUCTION



Praise be to our God for the honor and the privilege to serve in God's Kingdom. We are forever mindful of the fact we are in your hearts and prayers as we strive to make an impact in the lives of those we are called to serve in South Africa. The Baptist Convention of South

Africa is so grateful to God for many blessings in all our ministries. We are especially grateful that God has allowed us to focus on missions.

This year, 2022, the world was shocked by Russia's invasion of its neighbour, Ukraine, on February 24, 2022. The war contributed to the economic mayhem in our country. Pray with us for challenges of poverty, gender-based violence, the high rate of crime, especially crimes against the elderly, women, and children

2. THE CONTEXT THAT GAVE BIRTH TO THE MINISTRY YOU LEAD AND/OR PROVIDE OVERSIGHT.

The political and economic instability faced with high rate of unemployment and corruption in our country had led to the birth of the ministries below. The COVID-19 pandemic has not made our lives easier.

Ndawo Yakho: Your Place of Safety Abused Woman's Shelter

South Africa has high cases of abuse against women and children. The BCSA is doing its part through Ndawo Yakho women's shelter. Some of the serious challenges at the shelter are that the place is extremely cold and there are no heaters. Food prices have

increased for the past three years, and the shelter is struggling to afford groceries. With the increased number of clients and their children, groceries are becoming a challenge. An expectant mother who is our client gave birth at the centre and we did not have supplies for new-born babies.

KZN Floods and Langa Fires

Three of our provinces, Kwazulu Natal, Western Cape and Northwest, were affected by natural disasters. KZN recorded 459 fatalities due to recent floods in the eastern and coastal KwaZulu-Natal province. The province suffered the worst flooding in almost three decades during a severe storm. Thank you for all your kind donations towards the people of KZN who are badly affected by the floods. We transported to uMgungundlovu using three trucks of gifts to KZN, uMgungundlovu area on Tuesday, 7 June 2022. The team met Dr. Zanele Mfusi, Deputy Director, DSD Provincial Officer and Ms. Nondabulo from uMgungundlovu district. They identified two shelters in the Pietermaritzburg area, housing more than 200 families. We donated water, toiletry, food, toys, blankets, clothes, shoes, school uniforms. We will proceed to Cape Town next to assist the Langa Fires victims and the Northwest region to impact the community.

3. THE IMPORTANCE OF YOUR PARTNERSHIP WITH LOTT CAREY

The support of Lott Carey is heart-warming for the Baptist Convention of South Africa. The organization is the number one partner in our mission. Besides the monthly financial support which goes to our national office for distribution towards national ministries, the partnership has offered us learning experiences through conferences, material, and the pastor exchange program which has benefited our pastors. Some of our churches have enjoyed the church-to-church partnerships which have exposed our pastors to mission in the global village.

4. MINISTRY IMPACT. MAIN AREAS OF MINISTRY AND HOW HAS IT IMPACTED THE COMMUNITY

Theological Education: we managed to register more than 100 students to date since our partnership with Baptist Theological College; and 14 of those students are funded by the BCSA. Due to the high number of students, we are taking in the BTC program we need to strengthen administration and lectures. We are grateful to God that 44 ministers graduated at our February 2022 annual assembly.

5. SPECIAL PROJECT INTEREST

BCSA is blessed with Land: +21 Hectares has the potential of being the main source of income for our mission.

- Farming: There is a potential for farming, cattle, and sheep breeding, but also to till the land. In 2021 we bought sheep, 8 ewes and 1 ram. Today we celebrate as 6 lambs were born and added to the flock.
- Events Centre: We have built the hall and offices for BCSA to be used for our annual events such as the Assembly, Conferences and Rallies of our national and regional structures. The next project is to build the accommodation facilities.
- The Church seeks to transform part of its building to a place of safety for homeless people in the township who may need a place for a day or a week. In addition to that, we have high levels of poverty, and would love a partnership to help us with food and support for our volunteers.
- Building low-cost housing for our retired pastors will demand financial capital for land and building materials. South Africa has a serious backlog in terms of housing, and the government seems to be not coping with this need.

- Expand mission to neighbouring countries, sending and supporting missionaries financially.
- Our skills development program to be sustainable and impact lives
- Poverty and unemployment
- Financial mobilization and sustainability

Introduction



Allow me to greet you in that life transforming name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. It's an absolute honour and privilege to submit this report as per guidelines provided.

The context that gave birth to the ministry that you lead and/or provide oversight.

The Ministry initially started out as an outreach program in communities severely affected by gangs and drug abuse. With the escalation of these problems and the refusal of churches to receive those who made commitments to Christ, we felt led by the Spirit of God to plant a church to accommodate these and others.

How your work has evolved over the years. Is your ministry like its original focus or has the focused changed?

The ministry has evolved tremendously over the last 16 years, especially since our partnership with Lott Carey, which developed into a relationship with Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church, PA, under the leadership of Rev Dr. Alyn E. Waller. Ever since the partnership, we have grown in leaps and bounds, expanding both in service to others, as well as to other locations and countries beyond our South African borders.

The importance of your ministry in today's context. What value does the ministry bring to the community and why is it important to the Christian witness today.

Teen Challenge, South Africa and Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church have become household names in many communities where we are located, as well as several countries on the continent of Africa. Our work has been

- To help children, youth, adults and families with life-controlling problems so that they might become established in society as productive, contributing citizens through faith-based counselling, education, skills and job training.
- To rescue women and children who are trapped in gangs, drug addiction, prostitution and trafficking; to place them in residential care centers which provide a safe and home-like atmosphere, conducive for growth and development.
- Our homeless situation remains a huge challenge and is escalating to an alarming demand. We still speak to the objective and keep our doors open in to aid and alleviate the situation. 154 individuals have been assisted, and several are now functional and productive citizens of society, with a number who have been reconciled with their families.

The importance of your partnership with Lott Carey. Why is your partnership with Lott Carey important to the global community?

The partnership between our Ministry and Lott Carey are pivotal in this critical hour because we are enabled to serve the global village, meeting the desperate needs of people. This partnership helps us to expand our Christian witness in a significant way. One of the ways we do this is to provide food and healthcare supplies to needy people. The impact of this partnership allowed us to achieve the following since June 2021 to June 2022: more than 2,615,600 cooked meals have been served from 12 different locations. We also provided more than 5000 face masks, hand-sanitizers and other health products.

Ministry impact. What are your main areas of ministry and how has it impacted the community, including numbers?

The primary emphasis of the Ministry is to provide residential rehabilitation services for men and women who succumbed to substance abuse. With the escalation of this problem and greater numbers who require services, we've launched into development of a community-based rehabilitation program under the banner of *The Hope Revolution*.

With COVID restrictions lifted early in 2021, we were enabled to be more flexible in daily operations. Many of these visible impacts were made in our communities, such as:

- Community Outreaches – 18; People reached – 14,673
- Primary & High School – 16; Beneficiaries – 19,223
- Community-based Rehabilitation Centres – 7; Beneficiaries – 506

Special projects interest. What opportunities currently exist for individuals, churches and/or businesses to invest in and/or fund in the next 1 to 3 years? Be specific.

The Lord continues to open new doors of ministry opportunities across the continent of Africa. We presently have need for individuals who will join our team to establish and develop *The Hope Revolution* program across South Africa and the continent. The critical skills we desperately need are individuals and groups who can serve in these capacities:

- Development Director
- Social Workers
- Counselors
- Facilitators
- Volunteers
- Churches
- Business / Churches

The need is great for churches to come alongside and adopt a nation. This will enable us to accelerate our services in the 36 nations we have established relationships.

We currently have a desperate need to establish and develop sustainability projects. Skills Development and Training remain a concern on the continent. We have an opportunity to develop the current Accredited Community College in Cape Town into a flagship training institute that will serve multiple purposes. We seek investors / partnership to enable us to complete this project.

Prayer partnership. How might the Lott Carey family pray for your work in the coming weeks, months, years?

We will be grateful if our Lott Carey family can join us in prayer for

- Breakthrough in the current violence in South Africa
- Continental growth in staff and facilities throughout Africa
- Transport for our ministry team

Because of your support ZTS has been able to deliver and carry out its mission of providing theological education for all: fighting gender issues, marginalization, and stigma surrounding our context, all the while dealing with justice issues. We are able to provide highly subsidised theological education to all who need it because of the support we receive from Lott Carey.

1. Introduction

- a. The Context that gave birth to Zimbabwe Theological Seminary*
Zimbabwe Theological Seminary came to being as a result of the need to address a context characterised by the marginalization of women, ignorance, dictatorship tendencies, corruption, violence, poverty, oppression and poor theological education.

For some Christian denominations in Zimbabwe, women were and are being

patronized. They are not recognised in faculty, administrative and key church leadership positions such as the pastorate. In this understanding, women were/are not allowed to go beyond the general certificate of education.

Moreover, many pastors were/are receiving poor, if not shallow theological education which is not balanced either academically or spiritually. Because of poverty, they could not afford sound theological education. The results they have are not a reflection of their abilities, but a reflection of poverty-stricken backgrounds.

b. The similarity of the ministry to the original one

The ministry, Zimbabwe Theological Seminary, has remained unchanged and similar to the original ministry in that it continues to be a Christian educational institution with its primary purpose to equip God-called men and women of Zimbabwe and the region for effective Christian ministries, particularly in churches, and in the general society. The Zimbabwe Theological Seminary provides Christ-centred, biblically-based, multifaceted, contextually relevant theological education. In doing this, it seeks to give a balanced emphasis to the acquisition of knowledge, development of skills, and growth in spiritual maturity and leadership.

We look forward to offer higher qualifications than we are currently offering. We offer diplomas and if everything goes well, we will offer First Degrees soon.

2. The Importance of this Ministry

a. In Today's Context

Zimbabwe Theological Seminary is important to the Christian witness today because it develops students with spiritually, intellectually and practically skilled hands for empowering churches in particular and society in general. We are field-oriented more than classroom-oriented. Our students are hands on in the community during their studies as well as when they complete their diplomas.

b. The Importance of the Christian Witness Today.

Our ministry is very important in the community because it pronounces the

good news of peace and justice and closing the gap of inequality to the community and Zimbabwe in particular.

c. The Importance of our Partnership with Lott Carey

Our partnership with the Lott Carey is important to the global community because the primary focus and mission of Zimbabwe Theological Seminary is met and is similar to the Lott Carey Family's mission. Lott Carey empowers us to offer theological education in a way that is fitting to our own context without dictating to us.

Also important are doors opened by the global Lott Carey family for interaction with others around the world. In this way, ZTS becomes a family within the bigger Lott Carey family in the whole family of God. We therefore receive and send various forms of support from everywhere and to places beyond Zimbabwe.

3. Main Areas of Ministry and How People are Impacted

The main areas of ministry impact include

- **Theological Education to the poor and marginalized**

Zimbabwe Theological Seminary provides Theological Education to poorest of the poor. Zimbabwe is undergoing serious economic meltdown with inflation running more than 785%.

- **Evangelism and Church Planting**

Evangelism to remote areas such as Zaka, Mberengwa, and Chiundura among others, and even in towns, such as Harare, Bulawayo, Masvingo, Kadoma, and Gweru, etc.

- **Professional Training and Leadership**

Our ministry supplies other ministries with service providers, professional leadership, and training in many and varied ways. For example, we connect with the Ministry of Education through teachers, both primary and secondary; the Ministry of Higher Learning and Tertiary Education with lecturers; Ministry of Home Affairs, Defence and Health with chaplains; Ministry of Social and Child Welfare through social workers; Non-Governmental Organizations through development officers; Ministry of Justice Legal and Parliamentary Affairs through

National Healing and Counselors. Many churches are also benefiting from our ministry as Anglican Priests, Church of Christ pastors, and other indigenous denominations are trained at our institution.

4. How many people are impacted

The education that we give has impacted and changed the lives of many of our students and their families and the communities at large.

- Women are impacted
- The whole Zimbabwean community is impacted
- Churches are impacted
- The Marginalised/Disadvantaged/less privileged are impacted

5. Opportunities Currently Existing for Special Project Partnership

Land and Construction of our own Seminary building(s) is our number one project opportunity. We also need to start fund raising projects such as *chicken-rearing* project to increase our resource base and enhance sustainability of our project

6. Lott Carey Partners in Prayers

The Lott Carey Partners may join us in prayer on the following:

- *The need for our own premises:* A lot of funds are being used for rental fees for the premises we use. Pray for God's intervention and provision of funds for buying land and for the construction of the Seminary.
- *Scholarships:* Pray for God to intervene in the provision of scholarships to students who are not able to pay for their fees, though they feel called to ministry.
- *Fundraising projects:* We also need prayers for God to provide working capital for starting fund- raising projects as mentioned above.
- *The Evangelistic Drive:* We ask prayers for God to provide more vehicles(s) for the evangelistic drive to reach almost everywhere, particularly, the remote areas of our country. The vehicle we have as a Seminary does not suffice for this great outreach and is broken now.
